## Background

---

NATO and EU recognizes Cyber Defence as one of the strategic priorities. Cyber threats require a response that is both civilian and military and this requires well - trained personal on different expertise and training levels. To protect the cyberspace, we will need more research, better capabilities, more training and exercises in constant coordination with all relevant stakeholders to create a unified and coordinated Cyber Defence posture and to maximize resilience and protection of ICT-based systems. The work done to improve world's Cyber Security and Cyber Defence is still in its initial phases. We must lose no time in embracing this golden opportunity of the advent of the digital era to plan and implement the next steps together, spending efficiently, and that is only possible if we join forces.

According NATO Strategic Concept, adopted in November 2010 in Lisbon, Smart Defence seeks to stimulate synergies and foster Allied Nations cooperative efforts, in order to ensure the development, acquisition and maintenance of the necessary military capabilities. Smart Defence is thus assumed by NATO as a way of non-duplication and integration of national capability development initiatives (pooling and sharing), capable of allowing a better prioritization and coordination of efforts between NATO and Allied Nations.

In the area of Cyber Defence, there are already three Smart Defence Projects: Multinational Cyber Defence Capability Development (MN CD2), Malware Information Sharing Platform (MISP) and Multinational Cyber Defence Education and Training (MNCDE&T). NATO's Smart Defence calls for a renewed cooperation culture and requires an innovative approach in order to better enhance the Alliance's Cyber Defence.

The joint declaration signed in Warsaw on 8 July 2016, gave a new impetus and substance to NATO-EU cooperation, highlighting the need to adopt a multidimensional framework (NATO-EU) and a synergetic approach in order to reinforce the NATO-EU complementarity of efforts on the field of Cyber Security and Cyber Defence.

## Objectives

---

Building upon the encouraging results of the latest NATO CD SDP Conference, the 4<sup>th</sup> edition will represent an unusual opportunity to explore new ideas, towards a more synergetic approach between all the NATO Cyber Defence Smart Defence Projects, enhancing cooperation with industry and academia to transformation, innovation and capability building and reinforcing the NATO-EU complementarity of efforts on the field of Cyber Security and Cyber Defence.

In line with this idea, Cyber Defence related Projects (MNCD2, MISP and MNCDE&T) are strongly committed to join efforts and work together with industry and academia, building the necessary bridges between international and national initiatives.

This 4<sup>th</sup> NATO CD Smart Defence Projects' Conference has the following main objectives:

- Reinforce the NATO-EU complementarity of efforts on the field of Cyber Security and Cyber Defence.
- In line with the NATO-EU Joint Declaration, enhance the implementation of the common set of proposals by promoting a Synergetic Approach, namely on the areas of Cyber Defence Education, Training and Exercises;
- Develop synergies and stimulate the cooperation between all the NATO's CD Projects in order to foster new initiatives within this Project's cluster as well as with the wider CD community (e.g. national, international, academia and industry);
- Discuss a Cyber Curriculum and the role of Academia on the development of a Savvy Cyber Workforce, promote an active engagement and participation of industry and academia at NATO's and National CD Capability Development Processes towards Innovation and Transformation of Cyber Defence E&T;
- The "Cyber Academia and Innovation Hub" implementation.

This event intends to offer a free, open and wide discussion forum, providing industry and academia a unique opportunity to present and discuss new ideas, solutions and technical capabilities.
